### Building update

The building is really taking shape. According to Senior Construction manager, Rob Weise, the windows and roof are being installed. Work is also progressing on the exterior brick and stone work.

Inside, the rooms are becoming easier to distinguish because the stud walls are going up. In addition, Weise announced that ductwork, electrical wiring, and plumbing piping have been started. In fact, some of the wall work is complete enough to begin hanging drywall. The construction team is working hard to finish the building enclosure so that interior work can continue.
